



Advancing climate mitigation policy solutions with health co-benefits in G7 countries

Aims and rationale

Launched in **October 2022**, awarded in **February 2023**

To generate evidence which will support policymakers in G7 countries to advance transformative health-centred changes in the food systems, energy, transport and housing sectors.

This call is focused on G7 countries as a group of states with high levels of historical emissions and large economies.

Research Gap

Incorporating evidence on the health benefits of climate change mitigation could drive urgent climate action.

But this evidence is not always readily available to decision makers.

Activity

£17.6M funding for 10 collaborations between researchers and policy actors to generate evidence on the potential benefits to health of existing or planned climate change mitigation actions by G7 countries.

5 UK, 4 US and 1 Japan

4 Climate and energy policy, 3 Food systems, 3 Air quality



Leveraging co-benefits for healthy net-zero transitions in Japanese and other G7 cities: A scalable approach for transformative change, Eric Zusman, IGES, Japan

Work with 3 local city governments in Japan (Kawasaki, Niigata, and Hachinohe) to integrate health and related co-benefits into climate planning, aims to strengthen city mitigation plans which deliver health co-benefits
