


We conducted a study on the impact of the novel coronavirus infection on life in Bali, Indonesia.





### The Impact of the Novel Coronavirus

The survey revealed that 81% of respondents had lost income due to the effects of the novel coronavirus infection. Of that, 44% were the result of having been laid off or temporarily laid off.






